## CULTURAL CENTER

The Cultural Center, built in 1915 as Tarpon Springs' City Hall, offers the community a full schedule of art and historical exhibits throughout the year as well as special events and occasional concerts in the Center's theatre. The Cultural Odyssey Gift Shop offers a fine selection of jewelry, books, and gift items. Volunteers add to the Cultural Center's programs by helping in the following ways:

- ☼ Serving as docent or front desk receptionist
- ☼ Ushering at performances
- ☼ Preparing and serving refreshments at events
- ☼ Assisting in sales and creative displays in the gift shop
- ☼ Constructing exhibit materials and performing simple carpentry jobs

## HISTORICAL SOCIETY DEPOT MUSEUM

The restored 1909 Atlantic Coast Line Railroad Depot serves as the home of the Tarpon Springs Area Historical Society. The Depot displays exhibits that tell the fascinating and unique history of the community and houses the Society's archives, a collection of maps, documents, and several thousand historic photographs. The Society holds meetings and events at the Depot and at other sites throughout the City. The Society needs volunteers to help in the following areas:

- ☼ Assisting in the archives with cataloging and research requests
- ☼ Assisting at special events
- ☼ Conducting independent research

## HERITAGE MUSEUM

The Heritage Museum, located in Craig Park on scenic Spring Bayou, educates visitors on the relationship between the environment and the people who make Tarpon Springs their home. A tour of the museum includes information on prehistoric peoples through residents of Tarpon Springs during the Second World War.
