### Purpose and Value of Public Art

The City's living history, pristine beauty, and unique culture inspires a vibrant arts community: home to an annual en plein air event, outdoor art festivals, and the celebrated Leepa-Rattner Museum of Art at St. Petersburg College.

Although Public Art has a long history in Tarpon Springs, in 2007 the Tarpon Springs Public Art Program was formed. Appointed by the City's Board of Commissioners, the TSPAC administers the Public Art Program.

#### **New Public Art Projects**

The TSPAC aligns artwork design, scale, and materials to unique installation sites, and to the project goals of TSPAC partner(s). Project planning involves four specific elements:

**Goal:** What type of artwork is envisioned? Does a specific theme exist with which to complement the art?

**Lifespan:** What is the anticipated lifespan of the artwork?

Site: Does the site selected address physical environment, existing structures, and utilities, traffic, safety, and other concerns?

**Artist:** Will the project warrant a general call to artists, or selection of a specific artist or group?
